NOTES ON THE SPECIAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING March 17, 2021

The fifth meeting of SEAC is scheduled for March 29th.

Since the February meeting, the Chair, Vice-Chair and myself have initiated an inquiry, and we raised with the Council of Commissioners and the Board Administration the question of how to get visibility on the issue of bullying and violence involving students with special needs. This issue was raised in discussion at the February meeting of SEAC and at the February meeting of the Hadley/Philemon Anti-Bullying and Anti-Violence meeting. The current state of affairs in the Board is that the number of cases involving this specific group of students is not known, and there is no formally established Board-wide system or mechanism in place for counting them at the moment. As a result of SEAC raising this issue at Council, I am told that the Board is exploring it. Council members besides myself did express interest in gathering this data. In addition, the issue of more effective communication about SEAC with parents across the Board has been raised at our table. Ahead of our next meeting and in preparation of making some proposals about how to raise SEAC's profile, there have been fruitful discussions with the Communications Department at the Board. There has been an agreement to add information about SEAC under the Governance tab of the Board's website and under the Resources tab; eventually if Complementary Services has a tab added, SEAC will be featured there, as well. Also, the Communication Consultant suggested the possibility of featuring articles related to a variety of special needs, like ADD or SLI, on the Board's Facebook page periodically. For Autism month in April, George Singfield, who is the head of Communications for the Board but was formerly the principal at Darcy McGee, is attempting to resurface a videotaped student presentation about being Autistic and experiences at school to feature on the main page of the Board's website.

In addition to these public-facing efforts, SEAC and the Complementary Services Department have agreed that a guide to the IEP process will be produced for all parents of students with IEPs for distribution in the Spring when drafts are sent home, and in the Fall when final copies are sent home. Finally, the idea of hosting some sort of online event for parents during Autism month is being researched, so that this can be proposed to SEAC at the next meeting. Please stay tuned for these and other developments. If you have any ideas or suggestions for enhancing SEAC's profile or communicating with parents, please forward them to me or Melinda.
