REPORT ON THE SPECIAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

October 26, 2020

This first meeting of SEAC was held virtually on TEAMS. The meeting was opened by the outgoing SEAC Chairperson, Shannon Lafonde Davis, who also held the position of EDHAA Parent Commissioner to the WQSB Council. Having served in these two positions for many years, Shannon stated her appreciation for those parents, teachers, administration and staff, past and present, with whom she has served in an effort to make education equitable and effective for all students. Shannon reviewed SEAC's position in the constellation of parent-led governance structures provided for in the Education Act, its mission and the Fundamental Principles established last year, which will continue to provide the basis for its recommendations to the Resource Allocation Committee each year.

Shannon went on to chair the meeting until all the new officers of SEAC had been elected; then the new Chair continued the meeting. The roster of the new leadership team includes:

The elections, being held in the virtual context by e-vote, took more time than anticipated, so the planned presentation on the WQSB C-17 policy and Special Needs by Lisa Falasconi, who is the Director of Complementary Services at the Board, was postponed until the next meeting. Time was taken, however, to set the schedule of meetings for the year. I am pleased to report that there was such enthusiasm among the members this year, that for the first time there will be a SEAC meeting held every month between October and April (with the exception of December); normally, there are only 3-4 meetings each year with set agendas stemming from the Education Act directives only. This year, there was a consensus that the group should pursue a more ambitious agenda and try to achieve some forward movement on long-standing concerns. On the agenda for the up-coming meetings in the new year are business items like reviewing SEAC's budget and internal rules of procedure, for which a sub-committee will be convened to present a draft in the new year, as well as improving communications with parents around IEPs among other things. The next meeting of SEAC will be held on next Monday, November 23rd.

At the first WQSB Council meeting held on Tuesday, November 10, the election of a Commissioner, in addition to myself, from Council to SEAC was tabled until the next Council meeting on Tuesday, December 1st.
